

Spanish Minor Advising

* Students in the Spanish Program start their language learning at very different stages that depend on proficiency levels: some students take Spanish in High School and start at the 200 level at MSU.
 ** Other students speak Spanish at home, so they can start in Span 210W/311W but also can take some 300 level courses.

*** Others are starting from the very beginning and take Span 101. Keep in mind that Span 101 and 102 do not count towards the minor.

In sum, each student's starting point varies and we want to help you select the level that better supports your learning process. With that in mind, the best way to create a tailored plan of study is to contact your advisor or the Chair of World Languages & Cultures.
 The following plan will give you a general overview of our program and when classes are offered (subject to change).
