Admission to Social Studies Program: Student must be admitted to the social studies program in order to enroll in SOST 450, Teaching Social Studies in the Secondary School. Admission is limited. Preference is given to students who have a 3.0 GPA and who have significant global, U.S. diversity, civic and community service experience. Students are encouraged to discuss with their advisor about experiences a student may apply to each of the above categories. Students should apply for admission to the program one year prior to their enrollment in SOST 450.
