RESPONSIBILITIES:

Responsibilities include teaching courses primarily in law enforcement with emphasis on social and behavioral sciences. Course responsibilities may include some combination of the following, but are not limited to: Minnesota Criminal Code, Senior Seminar, Tactics, Advanced Criminal Investigations, Policing in a Diverse Society and other specialty courses utilizing the candidate's specialty areas. The candidate hired for this position will be expected to teach, advise, contribute to the growth and development of undergraduates in our Law Enforcement program and participate in scholarship and service activities. The department is strongly committed to diversity and preparing students for work with diverse populations.

QUALIFICATIONS:

- A minimum of a Master's degree in Criminal Justice, Criminology, Sociology, Psychology, or other area related to law enforcement.
- Potential for excellent teaching, scholarship, advising, and service.
- Ability to bring diversity to our department, college, and university.
- Law enforcement or other criminal justice agency experience.
- Ability to integrate academic and practitioner aspects of the law enforcement profession.
